



STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY - 2023-24

Introduction:

The measurement of student satisfaction can be useful for higher educational institutions, to help them to pinpoint their strengths and identify areas for improvement. Satisfaction ratings go beyond teaching assessments, which have a narrow focus, to include broader aspects of the student learning experience. To grasp the complexity of that learning experience, it is not enough to know the degree to which students are satisfied, it is important to understand the factors that contribute to student satisfaction.

The purpose of this study is to identify aspects of the educational experience that are associated with students' overall expression of satisfaction. Determining which features of the student experience are most closely related to satisfaction may provide information about actions that can be taken to maintain high levels of satisfaction and improve student learning.

Student Outcomes Survey asks students to make an overall statement about their satisfaction with their studies. As well, survey respondents rate many aspects of their educational experience, from skill development and personal growth to quality of curriculum and instruction. These ratings provide a wealth of information for exploring the dimensions of student satisfaction.

Objective:

- To measure the student's level of satisfaction on their experiences in Anwarul Uloom College (Autonomous), Hyderabad.

Survey Methodology:

Data have been collected from UG & PG, all streams for academic year 2023-24, randomly using structured questionnaire online and offline mode.

Questionnaire: The questionnaire consists of two parts:

- **Part I:** Profile of the Students
- **Part II:** feedback based on student satisfaction

Questionnaire is designed on the basis of a 5-Point Likert Scale ranging from 1=Poor to 5=Excellent was used to measure the responses.

Data Analysis Method: Data was analysed with the help of counts, percentages and averages. Data analysis is presented with the help of tables and graphs.

Chart 1: Gender of the Student

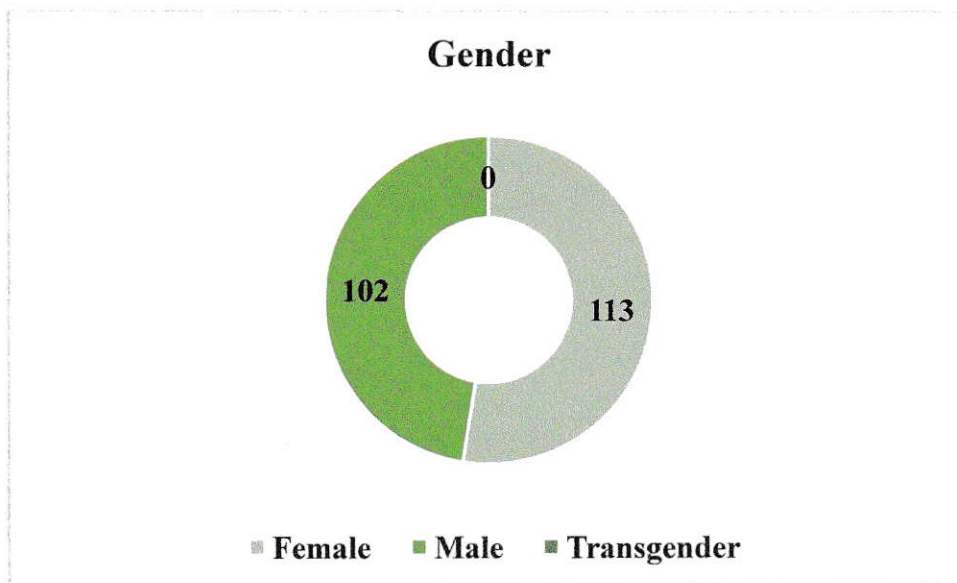


Table 1 depicts gender of the student. In this survey there were 113 female and 102 male students out of total 215 students.

Chart 2: Pursued Degree Program

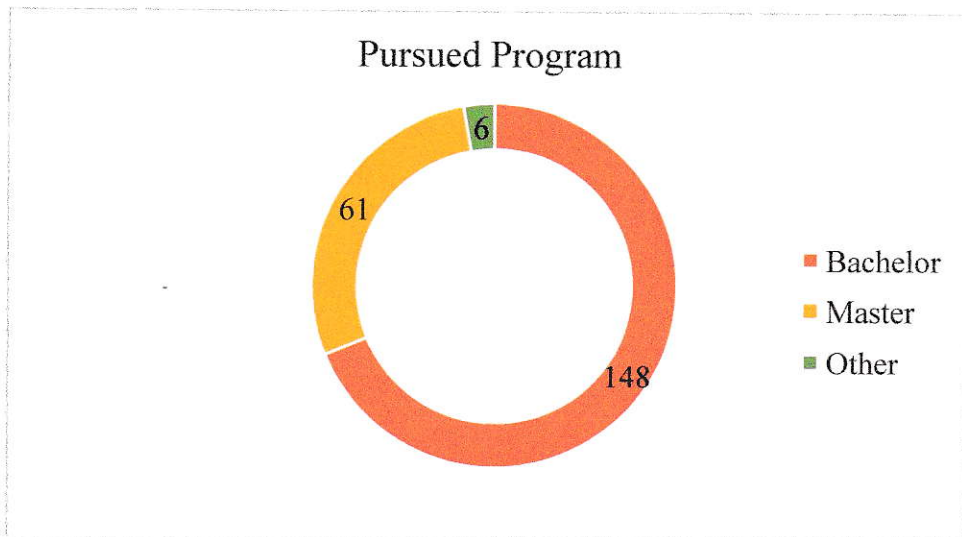


Table 2 reveals the program pursued by the students. Out of 215 students 148 from UG level, 16 were from PG level and 6 from others.

Chart 3: Subject Area

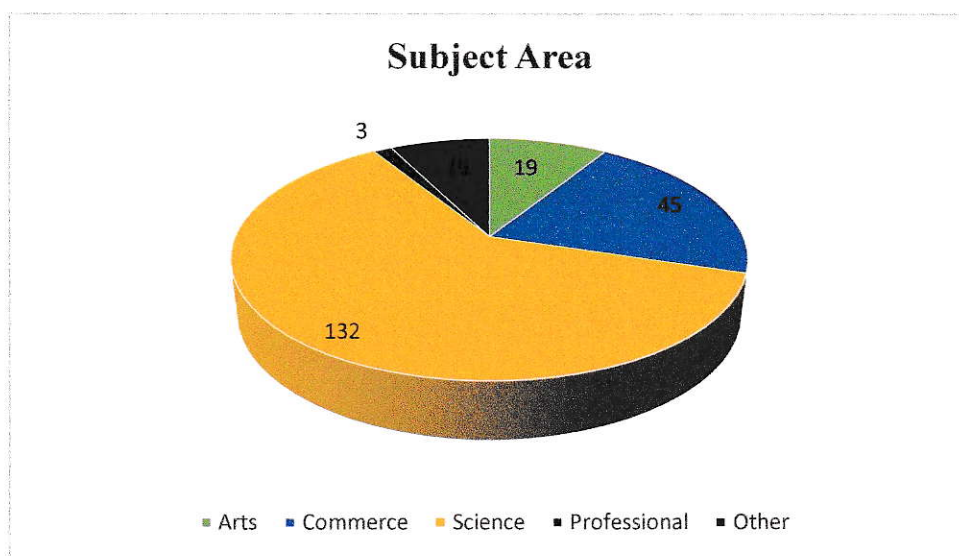
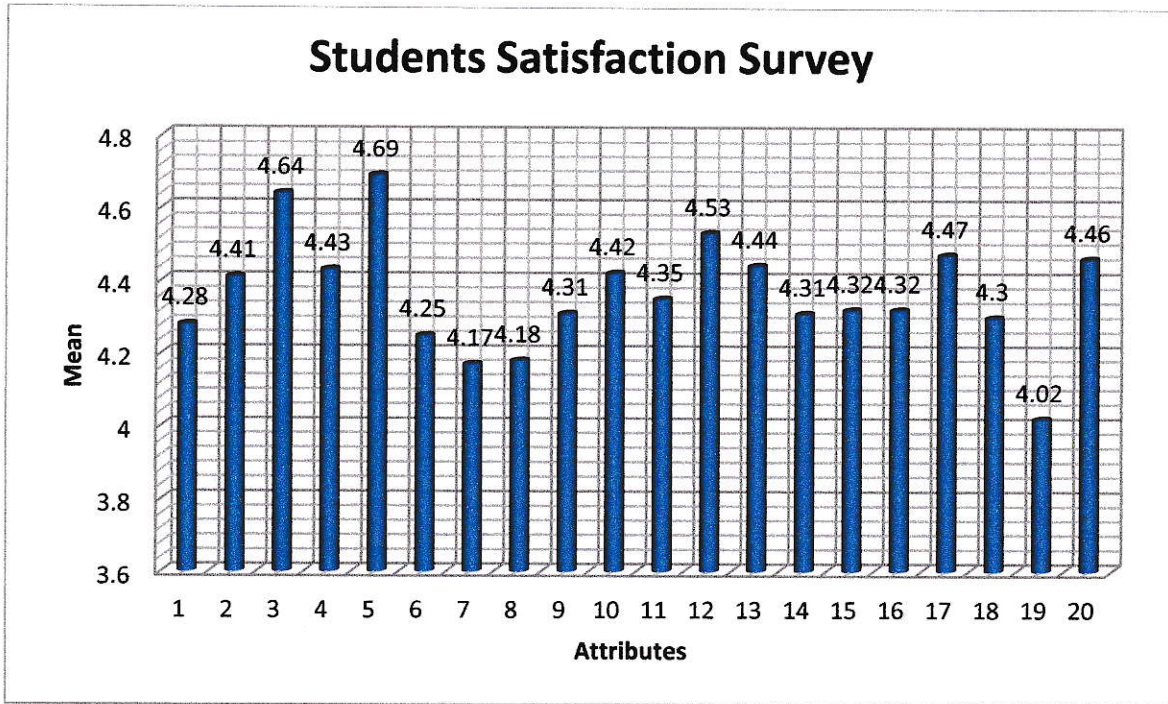


Table 3, reveals about subject area of the students and it was found that most of the students were from science and commerce streams, and very few were from another stream.
